The team members said . . .

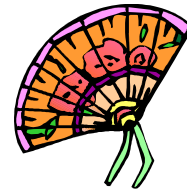

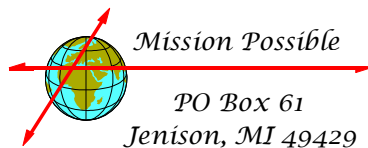
